Christina had a great job working at the front desk of a dermatologist's office ... then the pandemic hit. She was shocked when she lost her job last May.


Christina said, "I thought we were safe ... being in a doctor's office. But even essential services had to cut the schedule in half, which led to me being let go. It's just a struggle every day."

Christina tried for months to sign up for unemployment benefits ... often on the phone for hours trying to get through. It took her nearly five months before she even got the process started.

Christina's mom had moved in with her two years ago, needing care since she has a heart condition, so

healthy food is critical. *"Food is not cheap. Inflation is increasing every day on necessary items. And the healthier you eat, the more expensive it is."*

Christina volunteered at Three Square Food Bank several years ago, so she knew she could turn to Three Square for help. She got in her car, lined up with hundreds of other

after serving as a firefighter for 35 years, but that doesn't mean he's not working. His heart for helping others led him to volunteer at his church, where he learned about Three Square Food Bank. First, he helped pack food into bags and boxes. Then, he started making food deliveries to local seniors. So, when Three Square asked him to run a popup pantry at his church on Fridays, he gladly agreed.

Dennis may be retired

"My problem is I have a hard time saying no," he says laughing. "To give is to receive, and that's why I do it. And not just money ... give your time, talents and effort."

Though health and safety restrictions have made it harder to volunteer, Dennis still does everything he can to help in the wake of the pandemic.

"My wife and I both got COVID-19 early on and went through that whole process. Now I feel kind of resilient. Give me something to do and I'm out there. The people I see are clearly in need, so I feel good about giving my time to help out."

What has impressed him most during these difficult days is the outpouring of community support and encouragement. He has seen so many people in need who are so grateful for every bite of food they get.

"We help about 420 cars every Friday, which equates to about 2,000 people at just our popup pantry. It's amazing to see the smiles on their faces during this difficult time. And there are others who pull up and say, 'It's not for me... I'm delivering to neighbors.' People wait in line for three hours or more to get food. I feel humbled and grateful to help, but also sad that so many people here in Vegas are hurting."

When talking about his volunteer experience, Dennis is clear he "doesn't want it about me." Saying, "It's about the people I work with ... I have to lift them up, too. It's everybody serving as a team throughout the whole process."

"People were really nice. It was heartfelt that people were out there doing all they can to help thousands of people in the Vegas Valley. And it was good seeing other people just like me ... who had income coming in before the pandemic hit."

"Now I'm looking for jobs and it's really hard," she says, with tears in her eyes. "Thank you, because it

means a lot and goes a long way helping people in Las Vegas. Every dollar you donate gives meals to a needy family. We will be back down at Three Square helping you guys and donating as soon as we can."

The economy in Vegas suffered a devastating blow this year and affected so many of our neighbors. But thanks to your incredible generosity, they won't go hungry. Thank you for seeing the need and stepping up to help!
