The mission of Three Square Food Bank is to provide wholesome food to hungry people, while passionately pursuing a hunger-free community. Our vision is simple: no one in our community should be hungry. Three Square Food Bank is registered with the Secretary of State and qualified by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization, and a member of Feeding America. Established in 2007, Three Square is Southern Nevada's only food bank and the area's largest hunger-relief organization. "A great partnership!"

George Vaughn was living in Chicago in 2010 when he was struck with inspiration.

"It was a cold winter morning, sub-zero temperatures," he remembers. "I met a guy sleeping outside in a

tent. I knew in that moment
I had to do something
about this."

"That's when God gave me the vision for StreeHeat Ministries."

George launched
the non-profit that
year, with a mission
to help neighbors
who were facing
homelessness, hunger,
and other struggles while
living on the streets.

When he moved to Las Vegas several years later for his retirement, he opened a second location of StreeHeat. It wasn't long before he connected with Three Square and has been a partner now for six years. "We get a lot of supplies from Three Square," says George, pointing out stacks of 20- and 40-pound boxes from the food bank. "They are like gold."

George holds two
distributions per month
to help the community.

One is a walk-in event where he distributes up to 150 boxes of food to families in need. The second involves George going out into the streets, distributing bags of food to people who are homeless.

"It all adds up to feeding about 250 people per month,"
George says. He and his wife each contribute 10 percent of their pension funds to help pay overhead costs, but he says it simply wouldn't work without friends like you.

"If it wasn't for everyone who supports Three Square, there's no way in the world this could get done. It's a great partnership!"

A most rewarding job

Joe Leininger spent almost 30 years in food service before coming to Three Square, where he's Executive Chef and Director of Culinary Operations.

He worked in casual restaurants. He worked in fine dining. But his favorite gig was preparing meals for residents in a senior living community.

"Mealtime is often the highlight of their day, and it's a privilege to be a part of that," Chef Joe says.

He's still making meals for seniors — about 1,000 per week. His team also makes about 1,000 meals for children every day.

"They've lived amazing lives and deserve the best we can give them," Chef Joe says. "It's an honor to share the love with people and hopefully make their lives a bit better."



Giving Society members celebrated

At the event, members took part in a volunteer experience, packing 613 bags of produce which were delivered the following day to neighbors in need. They also heard from our President and CEO, Beth Martino, and several of our agency partners — our "boots on the ground" who distribute food throughout the community.

Additionally, our Executive Chef, Joe Leininger (see story above), prepared his famous tomato soup for our guests.

Irma McDow, one of our philanthropy officers, organized the event and said that Giving Society members felt they were appreciated and enjoyed their time *logethet*.

"As a long-time supporter of Three Square, I feel incredibly blessed to be a part of this team and engage with such amazing donors," said Irma. "It feels like my life, work, and passions have come full circle."
